1928

Leading by example

As a Russell Group institution, Bristol is among the UK's leading research universities. We are also a founding member of the Worldwide Universities Network, a pan-continental collective of 23 research-intensive universities. Together we seek to address some of the world's most significant challenges.

Teaching inspired by research

The curriculum at Bristol is influenced and informed by the research that takes place across the University. This means you will be taught by staff working at the forefront of their fields, and you will have the chance to engage in real-life research projects.

Invested in our facilities

Our modern campus facilities include 24-hour libraries, bespoke study spaces with quiet and group working zones, IT suites, state-of-the-art laboratories, a theatre and performance venues, alongside an array of specialist course facilities. Discovering a new city and making it your home can be one of the most exciting parts of university life, and our dedicated Accommodation Office will help you along the way.

Your second home

Our Student Residential Villages offer ready-made communities that help you transition to university life. Across these villages, you can find accommodation to suit all tastes and budgets, from shared Georgian townhouses in leafy Clifton streets to modern flats in the heart of the city.

A secure and supportive space

Our residences are all safe and welcoming environments, featuring 24-hour security and round-the-clock assistance from specially trained staff.

To help you stay healthy in halls, we offer a programme of exercise classes for all fitness levels, as well as intramural sports leagues. Student committees organise events and activities in residences throughout the year, including formal meals, theatre productions and summer balls.

Guaranteed accommodation



Student support

Our Student Services are here to support all aspects of university life – academic, personal and practical. Whatever you need, there is someone to help.

Before you get here: visas

If you need a visa to study in the UK, Student Visa Services is available to help guide you through the visa application process and support you during your student journey, including advising on the Tier 4 (General) student visa conditions. For more information see p35 or: bristol.ac.uk/visas

Arrive to a warm welcome

We understand that studying as an international student is a big step, so when you arrive in the UK you'll be met by friendly student ambassadors at Heathrow and Bristol airports, who will direct you to the University. Once here, you'll get a range of information to help you navigate the city and University in the first few weeks. Our International Welcome Lounge opens throughout this period and is a great opportunity to meet other new students, as well as staff who can help answer any questions. You'll receive information on everything from opening a bank account to your nearest grocery shop.

You can also join in during Welcome Week, which offers events and activities designed to help you get to know the city and make new friends. The Welcome Fair is always popular and we highly recommend taking part.

Course help from the start

If you are a foundation, undergraduate or postgraduate taught student, you will be assigned a personal tutor to meet with on a regular basis. Postgraduate research students will receive similar support through their supervisor. As well as providing pastoral and academic support, these staff can also give you information on specialist support available for free, such as academic writing assistance. Many courses also offer Peer Assisted Study Sessions (PASS), led by specially trained students in the later years of your course: bristol.ac.uk/students/study/peer-mentoring

Academic language and development

If you are looking to improve your academic language and literacy skills, we offer a wide range of development opportunities. You can take short pre-sessional courses, designed to prepare you for study at undergraduate or postgraduate level. We also run many free, subject-specific courses for current students. These courses will equip you with academic language skills that complement and enhance your studies. Explore the options available at: bristol.ac.uk/english-language

Health and wellbeing

Most international students will get free medical and dental care through the NHS. When you arrive, we'll give you all the information you need. We also offer a range of University-managed services to help you stay healthy during your studies including individual and group counselling sessions.

Mental health support

We appreciate that students with enduring mental health difficulties may experience additional challenges in transitioning to university. If you have mental health difficulties, we recommend you notify us soon after accepting your offer to study at Bristol, so we can help you to set up your support network before you arrive.

Fees and funding

Studying for a degree is an investment in your future. Find full details online about student loans, fees and the scholarships available.

Tuition fees

Tuition fees will depend on your course and your fee status. International tuition fees for the academic year 2020/21 are given in the adjacent table. Fees are reviewed annually and are not fixed for the duration of your studies; you should budget for an annual increase of up to five per cent. This increase does not apply to undergraduate clinical courses in Medicine, Dentistry and Veterinary Science.

Sources of funding

Scholarships

More than £1 million in international scholarships will be available for 2020.

Entry requirements

We assess every application on individual merit and consider a wide range of qualifications.

International qualifications

We have a transparent admissions process and accept a wide range of qualifications for undergraduate and postgraduate courses. If you studied at a school, college or university outside the UK, you will find detailed information about equivalent qualifications at: bristol.ac.uk/international/countries

If your qualifications are not suitable for direct entry onto one of our undergraduate courses, our International Foundation Programme may provide the necessary English Language and academic preparation.

English language requirements

International applicants are required to have a good standard of English to study at Bristol, and different courses need different language levels. The language profile needed for each course is specified in our online course listings, which also show the different qualifications that can be used to meet these requirements. Details of each profile can be found at: bristol.ac.uk/study/language-requirements

You do not need to have reached the required English language level before applying. If you can't yet fulfil the specified profile, we will include this as part of your offer.

Education agents

Bristol has agreements with various education representatives, or agents, around the world. These are listed at: bristol.ac.uk/international/countries. Representatives can help you to apply, but using one does not put you at an advantage or disadvantage when we consider your application.

Admissions tests

For some courses, you must take an admissions test before we can offer you a place. If you are applying for a medical or dental degree, you will need to take the UCAT University Clinical Aptitude Test (formerly UKCAT). If you are applying for a law LLB course, you will need to take the National Admissions Test for Law (LNAT). Some other courses, such as Veterinary Science, may also require additional assessments. You can find out the weighting of these tests in your application through our admissions statements for each course. These are available on each course page online.

Subjects

Some courses require you to have studied specific subjects. This will be included in the online course profile.

Mature students

We welcome applications from mature students and will consider a range of vocational qualifications, occupational and life experiences, as well as more traditional qualifications. We sometimes invite mature students to an interview.

Visas

Our dedicated Student Visa Services team is here to help both before you arrive and throughout your studies.

Tier 4 visas

If you are from outside the European Economic Area or Switzerland, you will probably need a visa to study in the UK. For most students, this will be a Tier 4 (General) student visa. If you are an EU national you may also require a visa to study in the UK following Brexit. Full details about visas to study in the UK are available at: bristol.ac.uk/visas


Our service to you

Student Visa Services will support you from the moment you accept an offer of a place right through to graduation.

Our advisers offer immigration information and advice in a professional, friendly and confidential manner. This includes Tier 4 (General) student visa advice and information about the attached conditions regarding working, studying (including visa implications following changes to your course such as transferring courses, extensions, suspension or withdrawal), engagement monitoring, registering with the police, and healthcare entitlements. Advisers can also help assist with visas for dependants as well as some work visas.

Applying

From exploring the University to receiving an offer, your student journey is about to begin.



1 Apply

Follow the online application instructions and submit your application. Remember to include any supporting documents required.

2 Decide

Many offer-holders will get invited to a virtual visit – these provide an insight to your future course and University life. The website and our social media accounts are also great sources of information.

3 Research

Visit our online course pages to select the course that is right for you. These also feature full module details, entry requirements and application deadlines.

4 Get ready

Once you have accepted an offer, you will receive emails helping you to prepare for life at Bristol. If you have any questions as you get ready, we encourage you to contact our advisers, who will be very happy to help.

Application deadlines

Some courses have application deadlines, which you will need to meet in order to be considered for 2020 entry. Use our online course finders to check the deadline for your subject.

Funding deadlines

If you are applying for a scholarship or funding, these will have their own application deadlines. You often need to have applied for your chosen course before you can submit your funding applications. Find out about common scholarship deadlines at: bristol.ac.uk/international-scholarships

Research degrees

If you are a postgraduate research applicant, you may want, or be requested, to propose your own area of study. The school website and admissions statement will give details on what your research proposal should contain.

You can search for a potential supervisor using our website. We recommend emailing the relevant school or faculty office to discuss your research proposal with your chosen supervisor before applying.

Offer types

A conditional offer means your place is dependent on achieving specified grades, and/or meeting our English language requirements. An unconditional offer means you have already met all the academic requirements for your chosen course.

Selection

The University assesses applications in accordance with a clear set of principles. Admissions statements for all courses outline how applications are assessed and the criteria used to assess them. Statements for 2020 entry will be finalised by August 2019 for undergraduate applications, and in September 2019 for postgraduate applications.

A-Z courses

We offer 400+ courses across a range of levels. Use this index and our online course finder to select the one that's right for you.

What you can study

- Pre-sessional academic English courses and foundation programmes to prepare you for a degree;
- Undergraduate courses, leading to a Bachelor's degree;
- Postgraduate taught programmes, leading to a master's degree;
- Postgraduate research programmes, such as PhDs and professional doctorates.

Undergraduate courses

The University of Bristol offers more than 200 undergraduate degree courses (eg BA, BSc, LLB). You can immerse yourself in one subject through a single honours degree or take joint honours and study two subjects alongside one another.

Most undergraduate courses are three years long. You may be able to take an additional year abroad or in industry in the middle of your degree. In many science, engineering

and medical science courses you can choose a four-year Integrated Master's degree (eg MEng, MSci). Dentistry, Medicine and Veterinary Science degrees usually take five years.

Postgraduate taught programmes

These programmes (eg MA, MSc, MRes, LLM) combine taught units with a research project, and are studied over one year or occasionally two. A taught postgraduate degree can help you specialise in a certain area, develop your undergraduate interests or discover a new field of study.

Postgraduate research programmes

On a postgraduate research degree, also known as a doctoral programme, you will conduct original research under the close supervision of academic experts.

A Doctor of Philosophy (PhD) is the most common research degree, normally representing three to four years of full-time study.

Our one-year or two-year master's by Research degrees include a structured research project, and can be a valuable foundation for starting a PhD.

Professional doctorates (eg EdD, EngD, DEdPsych, MD) are typically suited to specialist practitioners already qualified to an advanced level, who wish to deepen their knowledge.



Langford campus

The **Bristol Veterinary School** is located on the edge of the Mendip Hills in the village of Langford, 14 miles south of Bristol.

The landmark **SS Great Britain** is a symbol of Bristol's maritime heritage. Nearby, **Wapping Wharf** offers one of the city's newest locations for independent shops and creative cuisine, housed in converted shipping containers.

Bristol's **Harbourside** bustles with lively bars, restaurants, museums and attractions, and is a focal point for festivals and markets all year round.

Cabot Tower sits at the summit of **Brandon Hill**. There are great views from the top, which look across the city.

The impressive **Wills Memorial Building** at the top of Park Street marks the entrance to our campus.
