GUIDELINES FOR THE TECHNICAL ASSESSMENT

EDUCATION SECTOR FUND "DIGITAL INCLUSION: EDUCATION WITH NEW HORIZONS"

In the context of the call, modality A is intended for the funding of projects related to one or more of the lines of research defined in the terms and conditions, many of which are interrelated. Projects relevant and applicable to the Ceibal Plan will be prioritized, in coordination with ANEP (Spanish acronym for the National Administration of Public Education).

The following is a basic guide to the assessment of the projects. Each item and subitem is accompanied by a set of guiding questions to help undertake the assessment. While these questions are the basis of the assessment, it does not follow that the rating of each item or subitem should not incorporate or be based on other aspects that the assessor may deem applicable. In addition, it is clear that in some cases it will not be possible to answer all the guiding questions.
